

Ich sehe was, was du nicht siehst: Ways to play the / Spy Game



“Ich sehe was, was du nicht siehst und das ist blau.”

Basic version (just using the picture boards):

- Using one (or more) game board, take turns asking for items. Example:
 - Person A: “Ich sehe was, was du nicht siehst und das ist blau.”
 - Person B: mentions items on the board (e.g., der Schmetterling; der Vogel) until s/he has guessed correctly the item that Person A picked (e.g., der Vogel).

Other versions (using the picture board and the word cards)

- Put all cards face down onto the table. One player flips over one card. Then all players need to find the picture. The player who finds it first, wins a point. The person with the most points wins.
- Put all cards face down onto the table. One player draws a card and reads it aloud. Then, the other player has to find the corresponding picture on the game board. For example, when the card says “*der blaue Vogel*”, the other player has to find the blue bird on the picture board.
- Player A draws a card and reads it to herself. Then, Player B asks questions about the pictures to find out which card Player A has picked. You can ask questions like “*Ist es etwas rotes?*” (*Ja.*), “*Ist es rund?*” (*Nein.*).
- Each player takes half of the cards and a marker. Then, both players read the descriptions to themselves and check off the pictures on the game board. The first one finished wins.
- Using just the pictures, identify items by a color such as: *Nenne alle Tiere, die grau sind.* or *Welche Schulsachen sind rot?*
